STUDENTS

- If a student develops cold or flu-like symptoms while at school, they should immediately be isolated in the designated isolation space in the building.
- If a designated isolation room is not available, a minimum of a two metre (6 foot) distance between students and staff must be maintained at all times.
- A medical mask will be provided to the student and any staff member assigned to the student unless there are safety issues that prevent them from wearing it.
- Parent/guardian will be notified to come and pick up the child immediately
- Parent/guardian will be instructed to contact Health Links (204) 788-8200 or 888-315-9257 for further instruction
- If parent/guardian is unreachable and the students conditions worsens and requires urgent assessment, standard protocol should be followed
- Additional cleaning will be required. Focus should be on high-touch areas and locations where the child spent time that day.
- Students must remain symptom free for 24 hours before they can return to school or it has been determined that it is safe to do so by their health care provider of public health.
- Screening for symptoms is critical and must be done daily prior to attending school. Complete the [COVID Screening Tool](#) or at <https://sharedhealthmb.ca/covid19/screening-tool/>.

STAFF

- If a staff member becomes symptomatic, they should immediately isolate themselves from other staff and students.
- Notify your supervisor of the situation.
- Go home to self-quarantine.
- Contact Health Links, (204) 788-8200 or 888-315-9257, for further instruction.
- Additional cleaning will be conducted with the focus on high-touch areas and locations where the staff member spent time that day.
- A staff member must remain symptom free for 24 hours before they can return to work or once it has been determined that it is safe to do so by their health care provider or public health.
