







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Speaking an additional language expands opportunities to experience original literature, films and music from many francophone countries. Learning a second language also presents an intellectual challenge and the opportunity to learn about other cultures. It enhances students' self-esteem, responsibility for learning and independence.

French Immersion

- It is an officially recognized program of studies in the Manitoba public school system.
- The goals of French Immersion are to help young people proudly interact in French independently and spontaneously, and to see themselves as part of the Francophone community. Additionally, French Immersion empowers young people to engage as Canadian citizens in both official languages, thereby increasing their access to other languages and cultures.
- It is an opportunity open to all students registering for Kindergarten or Grade 1.
- It has the same essential graduation requirements as the English program.
- It is an opportunity to learn and appreciate the French culture.
- In keeping with peers in the English program, children in the French Immersion program acquire “academic, social and career skills; and the life management skills that future citizens will need to develop their individual potential.”
- It is a door to the future, creating opportunities for travel, study and career choice.

The French Immersion Program in the Louis Riel School Division

- All subjects are taught in French.
- The English Language Arts program begins in Grade 2 and comprises 20 to 25 per cent of the entire instructional time, as mandated by Manitoba Education.
- The teacher speaks French in all grades. Initially the children respond in English, but are encouraged to express themselves in French.
- Oral expression (listening and speaking) is emphasized in all grades.

Did you know?

- French Immersion first began in Canada in 1965 as a well-researched experiment in St. Lambert, Quebec. • The first French Immersion school in Manitoba opened its doors in 1973.
- More than 377,000 (2013) young Canadians are learning a second language in French Immersion schools.
- Canada is a world leader in second language learning because of the attention, research and development devoted to second language acquisition.
- French is spoken by over between 220 and 300 million people worldwide.
- Graduates of French Immersion Programs may choose to continue their postsecondary education in French.
- Parents of French Immersion students can become members of Canadian Parents for French.
- French is spoken in 53 countries and it is an official language of 29 countries.

French Immersion Schools in the Louis Riel School Division

- The Louis Riel School Division offers its French Immersion Program in total immersion, “French milieu settings”.
- All school activities, except for those related to English Language Arts, are conducted in French.
- Staff members are bilingual and communicate in French to provide a French atmosphere for the children.
- Communication between the home and the school remains in English.
