6.	Treasurer's Report	
	(see November 3, 2015 Treasurer's Report prepared by Kristy Beriault)	
	Kristy provided a summary of this month's Treasurer's Report. Fundraising Account book balance on November 3, 2015 was \$26,967.61. Our total revenue from bake sale, hot lunch (to be transferred to operations) and lunch fees donation (Mark won a year of lunch fees which he donated back to the school) was \$1997.54. No new expenses from the Fundraising account for this month. The Operations Account has a current book balance of \$4,637.56 (incl. pending transfer for hot lunch proceeds \$613.65) which includes recouperated money from a bounced cheque (\$125) and Movie night (\$402.95). Expenses from operations included movie night & snacks (\$34.65), EVB Bussing (\$2000), Peak of the Market error (\$20), lunch fees owed to the winner of the draw (\$70), and deposit for the Bud, Spud and Steak (\$150). Discussions about other items on the Operations Expenses list followed: Once money transferred out to operations account, there should be enough to purchase the water fountain – will discuss again in the new year M. Bosc requesting funding for outings for the patrols for a total cost of \$550. Decision made to split the costs with the school office. Pam moved to approve \$275.00 for M.Bosc, all in favour, motion carried.
