He / she has achieved an average of at least 65 % and has demonstrated good interpersonal skills and is sensitive to others.

Bourse École Varennes

Awarded to a student who attended École Varennes or Glenwood, and has demonstrated a very good effort and positive attitude. The student has had a good overall performance in school and is involved in the school community through participation in extra-curricular activities.

Bourse de Technologie

Awarded to a student who demonstrates promise in the ever evolving world of technology.

Bourse de la voix estudiantine

Awarded to a student who has shown leadership qualities by promoting a spirit of pride with the students of CJS and who has demonstrated a commitment to perfecting his/her French.

Bourse des Anciens

Awarded to a student who best exemplifies the spirit of the Immersion Program.

Awarded to a student who has maintained a consistent effort in his / her studies, has a good academic standing and has helped to promote a positive school spirit.

Awarded to a student who exemplifies a genuine school spirit by contributing positively to our good name.

CJS 20th Anniversary Arts Award

Awarded to a student who has excelled academically and has shown talent and interest in the arts.

CJS 20th Anniversary Athletic Award

Awarded to a student who has excelled academically and has shown talent and interest in athletics.

Collège Jeanne-Sauvé Parent Committee Scholarship

Awarded to a student who participates actively and positively in school activities. Is an all-round good student and possesses a friendly personality. Although academics are important, the student might be a higher "average" student.

Cory Anderson Bursary

Awarded to the graduating student who demonstrates ability and talent in art.

Councilor's Citizenship Award

Awarded to the graduating student who plans to enroll as a full-time student in any college or university of Manitoba and has maintained a good average while demonstrating qualities that equal a civic minded individual: leadership, respect for instructors and fellow students, commitment to academic achievement, and sportsmanlike conduct in athletic endeavors.

Dakota Community Centre Scholarship Award

Awarded to a student who has demonstrated a strong academic performance and a commitment to sport, leadership and volunteerism.

Damien-Bessette Scholarship

Awarded to a student who is recognized as hardworking and respected by his / her peers, and who succeeds through quiet determination and by delivering a solid effort.

Devin Fougère-Mitchell Music Scholarship

Awarded to a student who is an excellent musician and a leader in the ensemble with remarkable performance skills and a strong work ethic.

Food Systems Management Scholarship

Awarded to a student who has achieved academic excellence.

Governor General's Medal

Awarded to the Grade 12 student who has achieved the highest academic standing in Grade 12.

LRSB French Immersion Scholarship

Awarded to a student who has demonstrated high academic standing and has shown a commitment to excellence in the four language skills. (reading, writing, speaking, listening); is intending to pursue French studies at a post-secondary level.

LRSB Legacy Scholarship

Awarded to the graduating student who is the recipient of the Governor General's Medal.

LRSB Educational Assistant CUPE 3473 Scholarship

Awarded to an all-around graduate who has maintained a consistent effort in his/her studies.

Louis Riel Teachers' Association Scholarship

Awarded to a student who is pursuing a degree in Education. Has had a good academic standing. Has demonstrated excellent communication skills, interpersonal skills, leadership abilities and a love of learning.

MB Association of Teachers of Spanish Bursary

Awarded to a student who is pursuing a career as a Spanish Teacher or in a field requiring the use of the Spanish language.

Méritas

Awarded to all students who have achieved a minimum average of 80% in their Grade 12 year, with no grade lesser than 75%.

MLA Scholarship for Riel

Awarded to a student who has demonstrated good character and community service and demonstrated sustained achievement over the years in a given field. He / she has also demonstrated exceptional achievement beyond their identified capacities. The recipient must be a Riel constituent. The recipient cannot receive another award.

MLA Award for Seine River

Awarded to a graduate for outstanding achievement in the study of English literature.

Music for life Scholarship

Awarded to a student who has achieved academic excellence and citizenship, as well as extra-curricular involvement in music.

Norbert Philippe Scholarship

The former superintendent of the St. Vital School Division, Mr. Philippe has left a legacy to the three high schools of St. Vital by initiating this scholarship in collaboration with the school division. The scholarship is awarded to the graduating student who has demonstrated excellence in character, citizenship, community service, and academics.

Partners in Education Scholarship for RRC

Awarded to a student who has applied to enter a full time diploma or certificate program at the Red River College. He / she must also meet academic, civic, and vocational criteria developed by the high schools.

Prix académiques du CJS

Awarded to a student(s) who has been recognized as an all-around good student and has had a strong academic performance.

Prix Curtis – Ramsay

Awarded to a student who has demonstrated ability and talent in art.

Prix d'excellence René-Deleurme

Awarded to a student who is a graduate from the St. Vital French Immersion Program, demonstrating academic excellence and citizenship.

Prix du directeur

Awarded to all graduates who have achieved a minimum average of 90% in their final year.

Prix Espagnol – El Premio Vivo

Awarded to a student who excelled in the CJS Spanish program.

Prix Modèle Linguistique

Awarded to a student who has perfected their language skills.

Prix Shelly Glover pour leadership & bénévolat exceptionnels

Awarded to a student who demonstrates outstanding leadership in volunteerism and in the community

Rieja & David Leclerc Scholarship

Awarded to a courageous student who faces life's challenges by striving for personal excellence.

Rod Bruinooge Student Leadership Award

Awarded to a student with a high academic standing who demonstrates a genuine concern for improvement of the human condition through leadership in the school & community activities.

St.Vital/St.Boniface Retired Teachers' / Support Staff Bursary

Awarded to a student who is continuing his / her studies in a post-secondary institution and is a good all-around student.

Stephen Khan Photography Scholarship

Awarded to a student who has had excellent achievement in mathematics and is enrolled in the Faculty of Engineering or Science.

Technology Award

Awarded to a student who demonstrates promise in the ever evolving world of technology.

Terry Borys Scholarship

Awarded to a student who has demonstrated a genuine interest and pride in learning the French language and is continuing his / her studies at the post-secondary level.

The Riverside Lionelles Win Rinella Personal Achievement Award

Awarded to a student with good academic potential and is a good all-around student.

The Steven Vermeire Memorial Bursary

Awarded to a helpful and generous student who represents a calm demeanor and displays traits of modesty and honesty. Has maintained a good academic standing and work ethic. Will be continuing his / her studies in the area of skilled trades or will be continuing education in a field related to music / music production.

United Way Student Community Service Award

Awarded to a student who has set an example by volunteering in the school and in the community, who motivates others to get involved, who connects and works with others to make a difference.

U of M Chown Entrance Scholarship

Awarded to a student with a minimum of 85 % average in their high school program and is eligible to enter any degree program at the University. Will be enrolled at the U of M for the coming September. Is considered the best "all-around" graduate.

U of M Entrance Awards : given by the university at their ceremony – see university calendar for information

University of Toronto National Book Award

Awarded to a student who has achieved superior academic performance, displayed original and creative thought, demonstrated exceptional achievement in a broad context in History 30S.

U of W Entrance Award : given by the university at their ceremony – see university calendar for information

Vista Place Physiotherapy & Sports Injury Centre Book Award

Awarded to a student who has maintained good academic standing while being involved in sports and community service.

Winnipeg Technical College Partners in Education Scholarship

Awarded to a student who has registered to Winnipeg Technical College and who has graduated with a 65 % average.

Wyatt Scholarship

Awarded to two students who have demonstrated scholarship and constructive citizenship with potential for future growth. The recipients must be or will be registered at an institution of learning or training beyond high school.

SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION TIPS

INTRODUCTION:

The following provide some tips to help you to be more successful in gaining scholarships!

1. Make a list of all available scholarships

After you have identified the universities you will be applying to, make a list of all the scholarships and awards that you appear to be qualified for. To compile this list, use scholarship websites (such as www.scholarshipscanada.com or www.studentawards.com) and university calendars and websites.

It is also important to have your parents ask at their place of employment whether scholarships are available for children of employees and/or in the community. Note the deadlines for each award and the application process. Always verify deadlines for specific awards with university calendars or websites.

Apply only to those scholarships for which you are qualified.

2. Identify “Guaranteed” scholarships

“Guaranteed” entrance scholarships are often the easiest way to achieve a scholarship. These scholarships are based solely on your high school average as calculated for admission to the program and university you are applying to. These scholarships are identified throughout this book for each university where they are available. Unless otherwise noted, you do not even have to complete a scholarship application to receive one of these awards.

For example, if your high school average is 80-84.9%, you might receive an award of \$500 (sometimes renewable over 4 years). If your average is 85-89.9% you might receive a \$1,000 award, and so on. At several Canadian universities these scholarships are valued at \$12,000-\$16,000 (payable over 4 years) and in a few cases even higher.

These are guaranteed scholarships. Achieve the marks and you automatically get the reward! Once you have determined whether the university you are applying to has guaranteed entrance scholarships, ask yourself this question, “What would you have to do to increase your average to get the highest guaranteed scholarship available to you?”

3. Meet the application deadlines

Once you have verified scholarship application deadlines with the universities you are applying to, ensure that your application and all supporting materials are at the universities before that stated deadline. Most universities will not accept a scholarship application after a deadline has been missed. Even guaranteed entrance scholarships are dependant on you having applied to the university by their stated deadline.

4. Neatness matters

Your completed scholarship application makes a statement about you. A carefully prepared application with no spelling or grammatical errors creates an impression that you are a quality person. A disorganized, sloppy or error filled application gives a message to the scholarship committee that you may not be the kind of person they are looking for.

Completing a scholarship application (especially where essays are a part of the application) can be a major undertaking. Schedule your time to complete the application as though you were working on a major assignment for one of your courses. Ask teachers and your parents to proof your application for spelling and grammar as well as content.

5. Avoid emailing or faxing your application

Unless the university (or organization) specifically states that you are required to email or fax your application then don't do it. People in official positions (such as the people on scholarship committees) are generally very busy. Their email security system might even block your attempts to email them an application unless they are expecting it by email. **The exception to this rule is when the application form is online, then you are expected to complete it online.**

Applications sent by fax can end up being received in less than perfect condition. In addition, faxed applications do not always reach the right person on time.

Where possible, send your application by mail. It would make sense to send it by Expedited or Express Post in order that you have proof that it was sent and also proof of the date that it was sent. In addition, sending it this way allows you to track on the internet when your application was actually received.

6. Focus on quality rather than quantity

In writing scholarship application essays, some students focus on listing every little thing they have ever accomplished or every activity they have ever been involved in. It is usually more important to identify a few activities and accomplishments and discuss specific ways you were involved and affected. In addition, discuss what you learned from your involvement and how this will make you a better student (and person) in the university program you are applying to. Providing specific examples to illustrate anything you are writing about makes your essay more believable (and shows you as a more genuine person). Be positive!

7. Help your references

The people (often principals, counselors, and teachers) who are writing reference letters on your behalf are generally very busy and appreciate your help. Sometimes, they might not even know you as well as you think they do. You can help them by giving them a one page outline of your major accomplishments in high school and in the community. At the top of this page, state the university and program you are applying to (and scholarship). It would also be useful to briefly state a few reasons why you think you are the best person for this award. Your one page summary should also clearly state the deadline date (and other relevant details) for submitting the reference letter. It is very important that you give a person who is acting as a reference for you as much time as possible to complete their letter on your behalf.

A week before the letter should be sent, it is a good idea to remind the person (in writing) that the letter is required by the date you provided. It is always a good idea to send a thank you card to any people who were a reference for you.

8. Help yourself

Hopefully, you are reading this book at least a year or two before you graduate from high school. By keeping an ongoing file of activities, accomplishments, awards, etc., it will then be easier for you to complete scholarship applications once you are in your last year of high school. If there is something about an application that you don't understand, contact the appropriate person who is listed as a contact on the scholarship application form (by email or telephone).

9. Keep a hard copy

Applications can get lost. If you follow tip #5 you have a way of tracking the delivery of your application and also, if necessary, proving that it was received by the deadline date. By having a copy of your application, you are prepared for the worst case scenario of your application being misplaced or lost.

In addition, as you are preparing your application, save your work often and be sure to have a back-up file. Stating that your hard drive crashed or you had computer problems will not excuse you from missing a scholarship application deadline.

10. Know what they are looking for

Read the criteria for the award carefully and ask yourself, "What are they looking for?" Always attempt to answer this question as you are completing your application. Some university websites provide details of former recipients of major scholarships. Read these descriptions and look for clues that can help you understand what should be highlighted in your application and essay.

If possible, talk to former scholarship winners from your high school and ask them for tips. Whenever you have an opportunity to talk to anyone from the university (especially high school liaison representatives) ask them for tips. Don't hesitate to contact the university awards office and ask what they are looking for on any scholarships you are applying to. Knowing what they want can help you to be more successful. And follow the directions given!

Red River College Entrance Scholarships

General RRC Application Required

Entrance Scholarships valued at \$500 each, processed as payments to recipients' program fees, are available for applicants to regular full-time programs at Red River College who graduated from a Manitoba high school within the past five years. LEADERS OF TOMORROW SCHOLARSHIPS (6 awarded annually)

Must be a Manitoba or Northwest Ontario applicant. \$10,000 is awarded (1st year \$4000, renewable for up to 3 years at \$2000/yr). Awarded to exceptional high school graduates who combine outstanding leadership potential with academic giftedness. Minimum high school average of 90% calculated on the basis of results in: English 30S or Français 30S, Pre-Calc Math 30S and the highest marks in three of Biology 30S, Chemistry 30S, Physics 30S, History 30S, Geography 30S or another language at the 30S level. Demonstrated evidence of leadership qualities and future potential. Record of community and school involvement. Demonstrated evidence of special abilities other than those shown by academic results.

Advanced Early Admission Entrance Scholarships are valued at approximately **\$1700**, awarded to Manitoba high school students who apply for admission to the University of Manitoba by the Advanced Early Admission deadline and who present excellent Grade 11 averages.

Candidates will require:

- At least a 92.5% average in **5 Grade 11 courses**, including Grade 11 English and Math (Pre-Calculus or Applied) **plus the best 3 from the following courses:**
 - Biology 30S
 - Chemistry 30S
 - Geography 30S
 - History 30S
 - Physics 30S
 - Language (other than English)
- An interim Grade 12 average **at or above 90%**.
- Candidates must complete and submit an Application for Undergraduate Admission and provide an official Grade 11 transcript to the UM Admissions Office by **December 1st, 2011 (Advanced Early Admission deadline)**.

General Entrance Scholarships are awarded to students graduating from a Canadian high school with outstanding academic averages. **Deadline: February 24, 2012**

Five scholarship levels or tiers have been set, with the prerequisite average for each tier and corresponding scholarship amount determined on a yearly basis. Keep in mind that a specific amount for each tier may change from year to year. As an example, in 2011-2012, the tiers and the accompanying award values were set as follows:

Tier I	average greater than or equal to 95%	\$2,000
Tier II	average greater than or equal to 92.5%	\$1,700
Tier III	average greater than or equal to 90%	\$1,400

2. Must come from rural Manitoba and preferably from a farming community.
3. Selected from among the AESP nominees.

Value: \$24,000 (\$6,000 for Year I (tuition, textbook & living allowances) and then renewable for up to three more years.)

Special Entrance Scholarships

These scholarships are offered, **without the necessity of a scholarship application**, to all graduates of Manitoba high schools who meet the conditions below. **Grade 12 students must, however, apply for admission to the University by March 1.**

1. Only students with at least five 40S credits approved for admission to The University of Winnipeg will be considered for a Special Entrance Scholarship.
2. A minimum average of 80% on the best five of the approved 40S credits. (Standing in full-credit Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate courses is approved for scholarship calculation purposes. Interim grades, submitted by high schools in spring, will be used.)
3. The two students with the highest incoming averages will be awarded the \$4,000 Chancellor's Special Entrance Scholarships.
 - Students with averages of 95.0% or higher will receive a \$2,250 scholarship.
 - Students with averages of 90.0% to 94.9% will receive a \$1,750 scholarship.
 - Students with averages of 86.0% to 89.9% will receive a \$1,100 scholarship.
 - Students with averages of 80.0% to 85.9% will receive a \$800 scholarship.

ALSO \$600 President's Award of Merit bonus awards for the five students with the highest averages entering each of Arts, Science & Education.

Manitoba Apprenticeship Program

Looking for a rewarding career?

Would you like to learn a trade and earn a wage at the same time? Do you want a career where you use your mind and your hands? Do you want your qualifications recognized in other provinces? Do you want a good wage or do you want to be your own boss?

A career in a trade can be a positive, rewarding choice. And training through apprenticeship can be the ticket to your future.

Apprenticeship can lead you to well-paid, skilled employment. Through a combination of on-the-job and technical/in-school training, you can earn a Certificate of Qualification in a trade. This means your expertise and industry-approved skills and training are formally and financially recognized.

How does apprenticeship work?

Manitoba apprenticeship trades are listed on the Trades Training Requirements chart. If you are presently working in one of these trades and would like to become certified, ask your employer about an apprenticeship training agreement.

If you are not yet working, determine the trade in which you would like to pursue a career. Find an employer who will hire you and provide quality, on-the-job training. Then contact the Apprenticeship Branch to formalize an apprenticeship agreement with your employer. With an agreement in place, you learn the skills of your chosen trade by working closely with skilled trades people in this business. For the work you do, your employer pays you a wage.

About 80% of your training occurs with your employer on-the-job, working and learning the skills of your trade. The other 20% is technical, classroom-based training, taken either once a year in a block of time away from work, or in a more flexible timeframe. The Apprenticeship Branch arranges this technical aspect of your training.

The Apprenticeship Branch and the Apprenticeship and Trades Qualifications Board, in co-operation with industry, are examining more flexible ways to deliver this training. Some of the methods include day/evening courses and long distance delivery.

Do I get a certificate?

When you successfully complete your apprenticeship training, you receive a Certificate of Qualification confirming your status as a journeyman in your trade. In most trades, you qualify for an interprovincial or "Red Seal" certificate if you score 70 percent or higher on your final exam. This certificate allows you to work in other provinces where the "Red Seal" certification for your trade is recognized.

What trades can I enter through apprenticeship?

There are now over 50 designated trades in Manitoba and the number is growing. In most of these you can obtain interprovincial or "Red Seal" standing. Some trades are compulsory. This means the only way you can work in these trades is through apprenticeship training or if you have a Certificate of Qualification.

How long is an apprenticeship?

Apprenticeship trade training varies from two to five years. The average duration is four years. Refer to the Trades Training Requirements chart for the minimum number of hours of experience required each year. Your technical training will be the equivalent of four to ten weeks per year, depending on your trade.

Do I qualify?

Today's apprentices come from a wide variety of backgrounds and have a high degree of self-motivation and enthusiasm. They work in a wide range of trades. They may be looking for a first job, a career change or formal qualification in a present occupation.

To become an apprentice, you must meet academic standards and the minimum age requirement (16 years of age for most trades, 17 or 18 years for a few others). As many of the trades are technology-based, it is important to have Senior Year credits in mathematics and science.

Employers prefer to hire people who have completed or are completing high school. For this reason, it is recommended that you stay in school and broaden your scope of career options. If you don't meet minimum academic standards, contact the Apprenticeship Branch for information on upgrading programs available.

A person who has experience in a designated trade and wants to become a fully qualified journeyman, can apply to take a Trades Qualification exam administered by the Apprenticeship Branch.

What are my career prospects?

Employers train apprentices to become journeymen because they need skilled and productive employees. Companies put time, effort and money into your training. If you work hard and learn well, your employer will want you on staff after your apprenticeship training is completed.

What is the pay like?

During your apprenticeship you are paid an industry-set wage that increases over the length of your apprenticeship. The trade you learn is skilled and complex. For this reason, people who become journeymen through apprentice-ship training usually command higher wages than others who do not have certification in the trade.

The Manitoba Student Financial Assistance program provides financial assistance for educational purposes to Manitobans with limited financial resources. The funds are designed to supplement, not replace, the students' resources or those of their immediate family. The money received is intended to be used only for educational and living costs directly related to the course of study; that is food, shelter and compulsory costs for tuition, books and supplies. The amount of assistance granted is determined according to specific program criteria, up to the maximum allowable amounts. Loans must be repaid when the program has ended, or if the student drops below the minimum course load.

Education or training after high school can be expensive. Your costs include tuition, books and supplies as well as living expenses such as rent, food, personal needs and transportation. It can all add up to \$8,000 -15,000 or more each year, depending on your program of studies and your family situation. Because of this, you may think that post-secondary education is only for the wealthy. It's not.
