- The recipient will have satisfactory grades to enter their post-secondary institution.
- The recipient will attend post-secondary education within two years. For this award, post-secondary education includes, but is not limited to, universities, colleges, trade schools, etc.
- The recipient will have demonstrated a pursuit of self-betterment.
- The recipient has a financial need for post-secondary support.
